The New Jersey Chapter hosted the next reunion at the Playboy Great Gorge Hotel. In 1980, the first annual reunion with a scientific seminar was held in Orlando. In the succeeding years, the affair was held in Anaheim 1981, Boston 1982, Grand Island in Niagara Falls (NY) 1983, Indian Lake Resort in Chicago 1984, Orlando 1985, Virginia Beach 1986, Toronto 1987, Long Beach 1988, St. Louis 1989, Washington DC 1990, Atlantic City 1991, San Francisco 1992, Chicago 1993, New Orleans 1994, Las Vegas 1995, Minneapolis 1996, Dallas 1997, Anaheim 1998, Atlantic City 1999, Chicago 2000, Las Vegas 2001, San Francisco 2002, Norfolk 2003, Troy MI 2004, Las Vegas 2005, Houston 2006, Chicago 2007, Orange County 2008, New York City 2009, Troy 2010 and Las Vegas 2011. The reunion has served as a venue not only to see our classmates, but also to present talents other than our medical expertise during the Filipiniana night and to plan activities for our annual reunion in West Fairview the following January.

SCIENTIFIC SEMINAR: Three comprehensive, accredited half-day programs that cover a broad spectrum of updates and current trends in medicine, designed not only for the primary practitioners but also for the specialists highlight the event. *This continuing medical education activity has been planned and implemented with the Essential Areas and Policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME), provided by the [Philippine Medical Association in Chicago](#) which is accredited by the ACCME to provide continuing medical education meeting for physicians and takes responsibility for the content, quality, and scientific integrity of this CME activity.* It meets the criteria for **14** credit hours of the Category I ACCME Physicians' Recognition Award for the American Medical Association. Since the CME meetings are held only in the morning, there is plenty of time for fellowship, camaraderie, and reminiscing for the rest of the day.

HONOREES: The honorees of the reunion in 2012 will be led by the members of the Class⁵⁷ Diamond Jubilarians, Class⁶² Golden Jubilarians and Class⁸⁷ Silver Jubilarians. During the Grand Reunion Saturday dinner dance, the attending jubilarians are presented, first in slides the way they were in the medical school, then in person - the way they are now. CLINICO PATHOLOGIC CONFERENCE

CHIEF COMPLAINT. Low-grade fever, headache, and abdominal pain

CLINICAL ABSTRACT. A 36-year old male attorney presented to the emergency room with six-day history of low-grade fever, mild headache, chills, and abdominal pain, associated with sweating, redness, watery eyes, generalized body weakness and malaise. The headaches were relieved with 500 mg acetaminophen every four hours. Fever resolved on the third day, followed by centrifugal rashes which started on the left arm, then involved the upper trunk, and then the whole body, sparing the face, hands and feet. The rashes were maculopapular, non-itchy, non-blanching and non-burning with few petechiae but no purpura. Dizziness, blurred vision, hearing complaints, seizure, cough, dyspnea, heart and swallowing problems, constipation, dyuria, hematuria, were denied. The patient was not sexually active. PMH: childhood chicken pox; and immunizations were up to date. He had no other past medical history and was not taking medications. Family history: brother when young had meningitis. Except for fever, his vital signs were stable. No pallor or icterus. His conjunctiva was slightly injected. Fundoscopy was negative. No oral rashes or Koplik spots. No jugular venous distention. No lymphadenopathy. Normal breath sounds; no wheeze. Normal regular heart rhythm; no murmurs. Bowel sound normal; no organomegaly. CNS normal. Extremities as described above (Figures 1 and 2). Joints non-painful and nontender. He also complained of severe pain in the right iliac fossa region and watery diarrhea.

Complete blood cell count showed thrombocytopenia (platelet count $65 \times 10^6/\text{mm}^3$); leukopenia (white blood cells count $3.4 \times 10^6/\text{mm}^3$). RBC, hemoglobin and hematocrit within normal. Blood chemistries also within normal. EKG and chest radiograph normal. Urinalysis, urine culture and blood culture negative. CT scan of the abdomen and pelvis revealed normal appendix.

The following day, the headache was generalized, dull aching, and non-throbbing. It was transiently relieved by non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs. Although he seemed to be somewhat slightly confused, there were no evident signs of meningeal irritation. Brain CT scan was normal. Cerebrospinal fluid evaluation for cell count, gram stain, india ink staining, protein and CSF glucose/blood glucose ratio were all within normal limits.

The patient was hydrated with IV, analgesics and started on Doxycycline 100 mg po BID. He defevered.

Subsequent daily hemogram showed sustained leucopenia and thrombocytopenia. Hematocrit, liver enzymes, creatinine, BUN and chest radiographs were normal throughout the hospital stay.

Serum tests for syphilis, HIV, Rickettsia, Hantaan virus and measles and serum agglutination for leptospirosis were all negative.

Another diagnostic procedure was performed.
